# **GAHUM SA PAGLAUM: Building Alliances and Accelerating Success**

A Good Practice Documentation on Partnership with Local Government Units By the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program in Southern Leyte

#### **BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE**

The Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) which has been institutionalized under Republic Act 11310 on 17 April 2019 is the national poverty reduction strategy and a human capital investment program that provides conditional cash transfer to poor households for a maximum period of seven years, to improve the health, nutrition and education aspects of their lives. This is spearheaded by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD).

As the lead agency mandated to provide social protection and advocate the rights of the poor, vulnerable and disadvantaged, DSWD continues to address the multifaceted dimensions of poverty and promote sustainable social development by harnessing convergence and multi-stakeholder approach in the implementation of poverty reduction strategies.

4Ps started in 2007 and was expanded by the Government in December 2016 to reach a total of 20 million Filipinos belonging to 4.4 million households. The program benefits about 20% of the population who belong to the nation's poorest of the poor. Over the years, manifold evidence reveals that the program made significant impacts to improve the lives and empower its beneficiaries through its continuing collaboration with partners and improvement of its systems and processes.

To sustain the gains of 4Ps as the national poverty reduction strategy and human capital investment program of the Government, DSWD endeavored to implement the Kilos Unlad (KU) Seven-Year Social Case Management Framework. KU will guide the 4Ps partner beneficiaries to achieve a self-sufficient level of wellbeing. It is client-centered and with a participatory approach to harness the strengths of individuals, families, and communities to build their capacities and skills matched with available opportunities and resources.



The KU framework requires a multi-stakeholder approach to sustain the initiatives of Pantawid Pamilya in line with the mandate of DSWD. Central to this framework is the convergence of the Departments' programs and services and complementation with partner local government units (LGUs), National Government Agencies (NGAs), Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and other intermediaries in implementing and delivering social welfare and development services. The salient features of RA 11310 or the 4Ps Act and RA 7610 which is also known as the Local Government Code highlight the roles and shared responsibilities of the LGUs to deliver basic social protection and social welfare services.

Convergence, which is fueled by fervent hope to uplift the lives of the Filipino people, is certainly an important element of KU Framework. Hence, building alliances, especially with the provincial, city, and municipal LGUs, significantly accelerates success in the program implementation.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

The objectives of the presented good practice are as follows:

- 1. To strengthen the implementation of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program and sustain the gains of the program through successful implementation of the Kilos Unlad Framework;
- 2. To forge partnerships, especially with the LGUs; and
- 3. To solicit support and assimilate a sense of accountability from the LGUs.

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

The Province of Southern Leyte is subdivided into 18 Municipalities and 1 City, with 500 barangays, and covers around 18, 896 active household beneficiaries in the Calendar Year 2021. Based on the assessment, around 1,218 potential households were scheduled for graduation or exit. These households were either identified as self-sufficient, having no qualified 0-18-year-old child, economically sufficient, and have met the social adequacy indicators.

In the preparation and start-up stage, the Regional Program Management headed by Division Chief Paula Unay conducted an **orientation on the salient** features of the RA 11310 4Ps Act and its implementing schemes of the Kilos Unlad (KU) strategy for all the Southern Leyte provincial staff. Further, tactic sessions and coordination meetings were conducted to direct status updates of key activities, plans, and schedules of upcoming activities. A Series of meetings were conducted to heighten understanding of the processes and strategies the staff needed to employ. This activity aims to capacitate the field staff as direct implementers of the strategy and key actors in providing capacity to LGUs and other

partner stakeholders with the necessary knowledge, attitudes, and skills to ensure effective turnover and follow-up support and assistance to graduating program beneficiaries.

Additionally, a series of coaching and mentoring sessions were facilitated to Pantawid Pamilya staff (case managers) in identifying and assessing beneficiaries for transition to graduating beneficiaries utilizing the results of the Social Welfare and Development Indicator (SWDI) tool and assessment of the case managers. Provincial Links and Social Welfare Officers consistently monitored their staff and responded to concerns and inquiries.

The Provincial, City, and Municipal staff supervised by Provincial Link Riza Basalio organized coordination meetings,





consultations, and discussions with the provincial and local government units and other partners and stakeholders to tighten coordination and collaboration and to earn their support and commitment in providing interventions for the transition of program beneficiaries. These partner stakeholders were oriented to their functions and responsibilities in the KU strategy.

In these activities spearheaded by the city and municipal staff, a significant number of local chief executives (LCEs) showed reluctance due to financial factors.

However, this challenge did not hinder the field staff in winning the support of these LCEs. The 4Ps field staff earnestly coordinated with their LGUs, made follow through, and even actively participated in almost all the local activities to show their fervent aspiration for convergence in the service of the people, especially those belonging to the most vulnerable sectors of the society, such in the case of the municipality of Padre Burgos with Municipal Link Jieva Maldo.

All the field staff steadfastly spearheaded discussions and consultations with the LGUs and other members of the City and Municipal Advisory Council (MAC) to present the results of the SWDI and of the objectives, desired outcome, and impact of KU Framework. Through these initiatives, the program staff were able to win the support and commitment of the LCEs and other partners.

These initiatives led to the development of LGU's ownership and accountability of the Kilos-Unlad process. They showed interest in forging a partnership with the department through signing the Kilos Unlad



Memorandum of Understand Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program Specific Implementation Agreement. Further, it encouraged the engagement of other NGAs and CSOs in the provision of technical assistance and programs and services to the transitioning beneficiaries.

On 21 April 2021, the Department of Social Welfare and Development Field Office VIII represented by Regional Director Grace Subong and the Provincial Government of Southern Leyte thru Governor Damian Mercado, signed the said Specific Implementation Agreement (SIA) and Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). This was held during the Special Southern Leyte Provincial Advisory Council Meeting, in the presence of all of the 18 Municipal Mayors and one City Mayor, the forging of agreements sought to establish a sustainable partnership on the said KU strategy.



Governor Mercado, in his talk, pointed out that the signing of Pantawid Pamilya SIA and MOU not only symbolizes the provincial government's commitment to

support the program but also to strengthen its implementation. He said that over the years, the Pantawid Pamilya has faced several issues in the selection and inclusion of beneficiaries which were given due resolution by program implementers.

He also emphasized that the provincial government has allotted a budget

She attributed this to the strong collaboration of different stakeholders, various NGAs, and local offices for the disadvantaged and needy families in the province.




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
#### ON MONITORING OF THE EFFECTS OF PARTNERSHIP

Primarily, the impact of the coined partnerships or convergence are monitored through the realization of the partners' commitment or pledges which can be seen through the signing of the SIAs and MOUs, provision of support to the Pugay Tagumpay activities, and allotment of budget for the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program implementation in the localities.

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#### **RESULTS/IMPACT**

The consistent communication, collaboration, and building up of capacities through orientation, meetings, deepening sessions and consultations strengthened the ownership and accountabilities of both internal (DSWD staff) and the external (LGUs, NGAs, CSOs, among others) implementers of the Kilos-Unlad (KU) strategy. These efforts were vital in ensuring that partner stakeholders will provide technical and resource augmentation for the responsive and efficient implementation of the objectives of the strategy especially in strengthening their capacity to implement and deliver intervention programs and services that will uplift the wellbeing of the Pantawid beneficiaries. These initiatives led to the forging of partnership and development of commitment of the partner stakeholders through the signed MOA and SIA.

These efforts or initiatives require the constant provision of technical assistance, monitoring, and evaluation of the steps undertaken by the established P/MAC as the direct implementers at the local level to improve efforts and comply with the objectives of the KU strategy. More importantly, because of these efforts both internal and external implementers are fully aware that the evidence of these initiatives entails the inclusion of intervention programs and services in the LGU's social protection and development plans that will ensure regular funding. This will support and sustain the efforts of KU strategy for the households who will graduate from the program.

Moreover, the convergence with the LGUs paved the way for the expression of commitments and support of the partner stakeholders towards harmonized and joint efforts in delivering responsive programs and services to Pantawid beneficiaries. This was concretized through the following:

Nine (9) LGUs with internal arrangement through the LSWDO to prioritize Pantawid Pamilya beneficiaries as recipient of their programs and services. "My respect to our beloved Mayor, Hon. Herminigildo Culpa, as well as his Vice Mayor Hon. Petche Poblete, and to his SB members, and to MSWDO Maam Asuncion Dizon, and to our tireless PL Riza Basalio and ML Jieva Maldo despite the challenges, nakumbati la gihap, co-graduates, visitors, a pleasant afternoon to us all.

Today is the day we look forward, whether we like it or not, cannot be stopped.

I am here in front of you, to give gratitude to everything I have received. But before that, allow me to share my life story before we were included in the 4Ps (Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program).

At 27 years old, I was married and lived 8 kms away from the town proper up in the mountains, wherein, our livelihood was cultivation. We experienced a lot of hardships where our fingers lost count anymore. But because we believed that there is God, our redeemer, we continued on moving forward slowly, to give hope with our dreams for our children.

We have 3 kids, 2 boys and a 6-year-old girl. With my eldest, we were really low during that time because that was the time where Jimmy is going to school, and that was also during that time when our youngest (Jay Ann) was born (2003).



And even though we were at the deepest parts of our lives, we still push through with our daily bread, which is cultivating rice. There were times wherein for a month we lived near there because It's near harvest season and it was really hard for us because our kids don't want to be temporarily sheltered by their grandparents, that's why I encouraged them to study hard because it's really hard if time goes by, we will still be in the same situation like this. Poverty is not a hindrance to success but a stepping stone towards success.

Year 2012 when 4Ps came and we were one of the beneficiaries, only 2 of our children were included because my eldest was over-aged to be a beneficiary of the program. To our grant received, it was a really big help for my kids to go to school because it eased our daily living, our food security, kids' vitamins, and during payouts, kids requesting "Chooks-to-go" because it's the only time where my kids can partake sumptuous food after payout. Now, I have 2 kids who finished education. One is a criminology graduate through God's intervention, passed the criminology examination board exam and civil service, but didn't become police because of his genital disorder. Now he is working in Tacloban. The youngest finished Business Administration and now working in Jollibee Maasin. The grant may not suffice all the finances for our children's education, but it's a big help for us, that is why even if we will be out from being a beneficiary of 4ps, we still have a store for SLP where our LGU gave additional capital, it's for us to continue or discontinue just like a candle not anymore lit.

To end, I would like to give thanks to our government because we were one of the chosen beneficiaries of 4Ps Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program for almost 9 years, played a big role in our lives. So many lessons were learned because of FDS with the help of our strong ML Maam Jieva, where even though we are at the end of our journey as beneficiaries, the program will still continue.

I repeat, poverty is not a hindrance to success, but a stepping stone towards success.

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#### LESSONS LEARNED

For broader grassroots-level interventions to support the Pantawid Pamilya beneficiaries' sustainable transition out of poverty, there is a need for a multistakeholder's approach that will allow partners to bring their diverse strengths and resources to bear the nation's efforts to reduce poverty. Thus, constant provision of technical assistance, capacity building initiatives, meetings, consultation, coordination meetings, and the like are essential to consistently mobilize both internal and external stakeholders. This must be done with the intention of facilitating and strengthening responsibilities and commitments per agency mandates toward meeting the objectives of the Kilos-Unlad strategy. Further, this effort will lead to harmonized efforts in delivering programs and services that will improve and sustain the lives of Pantawid Pamilya beneficiaries away from the trap of poverty.

The converging efforts of the RPMO and of the provincial operations office of Southern Leyte to strengthen the capacities and develop the ownership of the internal and external implementer paved the way to ensure their accountability in all stages of the implementation of the Kilos Unlad strategy. This is possible through constant conduct of consultations, coordination meetings, capacity-building activities, and orientations with both the department's staff and partner stakeholders especially the Local Government Units.

The timely feedback and responses to concerns raised by the MAT and the provision of technical assistance helped the direct implementers in collaborating with the LGUs. Through their ability to address the concerns of the LGUs like the financial cost that the strategy requires, the program implementers were still able to gain their support and commitment to the strategy.

#### IMPLICATION FOR REPLICATION

In the Eastern Visayas region, the province of Southern Leyte was the first to hold a successful ceremonial signing of agreements on the Kilos Unlad Social Case Management Strategy last 21 April 2021. This activity was participated by all 19 local chief executives of Southern Leyte.

This was followed by the Province of Northern Samar on 22 June 22 2021 which was held during the Provincial Advisory Council Special Meeting, in the presence of the three Municipal Mayors - Hon. Galahad Vicencio of Catubig, Atty. Clarence Dato of San Jose, and Hon. Felipe O. Sosing who personally attended the meeting. Other Local Chief Executives and representatives attended the meeting virtually. The forging of agreements sought to establish a sustainable partnership on the said strategy.

Governor Ongchuan, in his talk, pointed out that the signing of Pantawid Pamilya SIA and MOU not only symbolizes the provincial government's commitment to support the program but also to strengthen its implementation.

Then the Province of Leyte followed thru Governor Leopoldo Dominico Petilla last July 7, 2021. Also held during the Provincial Advisory Council Meeting, 41 Municipal Mayor signed the forging of agreements that sought to establish a sustainable partnership on the said strategy.

Governor Petilla, in his talk, pointed out that the signing of Pantawid Pamilya SIA and MOU symbolizes the provincial government's strong convergence with all national government agencies in the provision of social welfare services to the vulnerable and marginalized Leyteños.

On the other hand, 4Ps National Program Manager Gemma Gabuya highlighted the role of the Local Government Units in the successful implementation of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program or the RA 11310. She explained that as the national poverty reduction program of the government, the program is no longer focused on compliance but on lifting the household beneficiaries' level of well-being from survival to self-sufficiency towards their graduation/exit from the program. She encouraged all the Mayors to do their part by providing complementary programs and services to the program beneficiaries.

She also commended the Pantawid Pamilya FO VIII thru the leadership of its Division Chief Paula Unay for the successful conduct of the activity and thanked all the Local Chief Executives for their enormous support of the program.


WHEREAS, The State shall promote a just and dynamic social order thereby uplifting its citizens and marginalized sectors from poverty through policies that provide adequate social services, promote full employment, a rising standard of living, and an improved quality of life for all. The State further recognizes the need to foster social justice as provided for in Article XIII of the 1987 Constitution;

WHEREAS, The Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) is the national poverty reduction strategy and a human capital investment program that provides conditional cash transfer to poor households for a maximum period of seven (7) years, to improve the health, nutrition and education aspect of their lives as provided for under Republic Act No. 11310 pursuant to the above constitutional mandate;

WHEREAS, The DSWD envisions a society where the poor, vulnerable and disadvantaged individuals, families, and communities are empowered to have an improved quality of life and take protection of the poor and marginalized member of society as its main mission, also referred to as "Social Protection";

WHEREAS, The Municipal Government of Padre Burgos recognizes its role in ensuring inclusive development and commits to address the needs of the poor within its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, The Sangguniang Bayan of the Municipality of Padre Burgos, in support of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program of the National Government hereby institutionalize and

#### Section 4. EXPANDED BENEFITS OF THE PANTAWID PAMILYANG PILIPINO PROGRAM (4P5)

Section 5. FUNDING. The Local Government shall allocate the funds necessary to cover the expenses needed for the implementation of this Ordinance and its projects, programs and activities.

Section 6. GOVERNING LAW. In the implementation of this Ordinance, the provisions of Republic Act No. 11310, otherwise known as the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (49s) Act and its implementing rules and regulations, shall be deemed written unto this ordinance.

Section 7. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. In the event that any section or provision of this. Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, other section or provisions unaffected shall remain valid and effective.

Section 8. REPEALING CLAUSE. All prior inconsistent Ordinances are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.

Section 9. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately, and shall continue to be in force and effect until revoked or set aside.

Section 2. APPLICABILITY. This Ordinance is applicable to all qualified Pantawid Parmiyang Pilipino Program (4PS) Beneficiaries under Republic Act No. 11310 residing in the Pumicipality of Padre Burgos.

Section 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS. As used in this Ordinance, the following terms are hereby defined as follows:

A. Beneficiaries refers to the households identified by the DSWD for estitlement to the monthly conditional cash grants as provided under Republic Act No. 11310 residing in the Municipality of Padre Burgos.

 Benefits refers to the expanded benefits herein described in Section 4 of this Ordinance.

C. Case management refers to a process used by the DSWD to enable the household beneficiaries to improve their functioning by dealing with their difficulties specifically in complying with the terms of the program hence the development of Kilos-Uniad 7-year case management strategy.

D. Family Development Sessions (FDS) refers parent group activity attended by the main grantee/s of the household, usually mothers, to enhance their parenting capabilities and encourage them to be more active citizens of the society.

E. Institutionalization refers to expanding the benefits of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) to be received by the beneficiaries of the program who are residents of the Municipality of Padre Burgos.

F. Kilos Unlad Case Management Framework. Kilos-Unlad is a social case management strategy which aims to guide the households (HHs) in achieving improved well-being, stepping out of poverty, and employing individual/family cooperation.

# Section 4. CREATION OF SUB-COMMITTEES/TEAMS TO SUPPORT THE LOCAL ADVISORY COUNCIL (LAC)

The Local Government thru Local Advisory Council (UAC)-4ps may organize subcommittees/teams which are deemed necessary for the support in institutionalizing the expanded benefits of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4ps) beneficiaries in the Municipality of Padre Burgos, to wit:


A. Case Management Team (Kilos UnladCase Management Framework).

A developed standardized procedure, mechanisms and tools to ensure that householdbeneficiaries are assessed on their level of well-being and status of compliance to the conditions of the Program upon entry into and until they exit from the program within a 7-year operational timeline.



This is an agreement signed between the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) and the Provincial Government of Southern Leyte. It details the implementation arrangements for the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program in the province anchored on Republic Act 11310 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations.

#### ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

In adherence to the 4Ps law, Provincial Local Government Unit partners are enjoined to have clear and targeted programs for the beneficiaries ensuring that their wellbeing is improved and not slide back to poverty. The program specifically would like to propose below minimum critical roles and responsibilities:

#### A. Roles and Responsibilities of DSWD

The DSWD at the regional level, shall serve as the planning, coordinating, implementing and monitoring body of the program reporting to the DSWD Central Office. It shall establish an arrangement of line of authority, communications, and the roles and responsibilities of the different divisions, including provincial, city/municipal structures, in the implementation of the program.

Pursuant to this agreement, the DSWD shall:

- Advocate for the implementation of 4Ps as the national poverty reduction and a human capital investment program that provides conditional cash transfer to qualified household – beneficiaries.
- Identify and select the target household beneficiaries on the basis of a uniform, objective and transparent selection process as indicated in Section 5 of the Panlawid Act.
- Provide cash transfer to the identified and qualified program beneficiaries;
- Lead and coordinate with different national and local government agencies including organizations from the private sector to ensure full implementation of statutory commitments herein;
- Review and recommend in collaboration with other partner devolved government agencies policy development and enhancement to further improve the implementation of the program through the regular conduct of advisory council meetings.
- . Roles and Responsibilities of the PROVINCIAL Local Government Unit. The PLGU shall:



- Provide relevant data to the DSWD in a timely manner, important for informed decision making by the DSWD on the implementation of its various programs and services;
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- Adopt the implementation of the Kilos Uniad Seven Year Social Case Management Strategy of the DSWD 4Ps.
- Support in the referral of beneficiary household member/s needing programs and services not offered in the 4Ps and LGU, and;
- Provide necessary recommendations and suggestions to improve KU guidelines, processes and tools;
- 8 Adopt measures to ensure the safety and security of DSWD personnel who may be assigned to work in the Municipality.
- 9 Work with the DSWD in ensuring all Kilos –Unlad implementation activities in the Municipality are implemented in a participatory and transparent manner, in ways that build greater social accountability of government to citizens, while securing efficient and effective delivery of results.

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# Section 6: Resources to be provided

Each party shall be responsible for allocating and managing resources to cover the costs of the Kilos-Unlad (KU) implementation to realize the purpose of this agreement, and to cover activities and matters related to the fulfilment of each party's responsibilities as stipulated under section 2 above.

# Section 7: Grievance Redress System

A grievance redress system (GRS) shall be jointly established or strengthened by the LGU and the DSWD to provide a venue for the stakeholders to raise their concerns of complaints on any aspect of implementation of KU or any of the staff (both LGU and DSWD) involved in implementation. Any of the available systems existing in the Municipality maybe used to capture grievances. These systems include the LGU's own the LGU's own that the local system (e.g. Lupon ng Tagapamayapa structure), or the DSWD's Grievance Redressystem (e.g. Lupon ng Tagapamayapa structure).



Ensure that the budgets needed to provide complementary services to improve the well-being of 4Ps households shall be included in Annual Investment Plan and Local Poverty Reduction Action Plan.

- Monitor availability of the required supply side, complementary services, logistical support to ensure that beneficiaries are able to comply with the program conditions and their eventual exit from the program such as livelihood assistance, scholarship programs, etc.
- Conduct of regular advisory council meetings and address and monitor program implementation concerns such as provision of supply side needs and complimentary programs and services;
- Provide the necessary support to the Cities/Municipalities in the Pantawid Parnilya implementation especially the relevant interventions for transitioning households.
- Provide conductive office space and other logistical support to the Provincial Pantawid Staff such as but not limited to office supplies, equipment, among others for the period of program implementation.
- Designate a Provincial LGU link to assist the DSWD in the implementation of all 4Ps activities in the province.
- Advocate to other agencies and Civil Society Organizations, Private and Business Sectors and other intermediaries to gain support in the implementation of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program.

#### C. EFFECTIVITY AND AMENDMENTS

This Agreement shall take effect upon signing of the parties unless otherwise revoked by any of the parties.
